Welcome

Training

On 9th April we will organise a training day for the volunteers. This will mainly cover rigging the boats and going through the safety boat procedures. We will practice man overboard recovery, boat recovery and towing.

Please could as many volunteers try and attend these sessions, especially our powerboat drivers.

First Aid

We endeavour to try and create a safe environment for all our members. Part of this is to ensure that as many of our volunteers as possible have completed a recognised First Aid training course. Guidelines state that the certificate is only valid for 3 years and hence people are requested to retake the training from time to time. The RYA recognised course is

developed for Sailing clubs and provides basic skills in CPR and treating minor injuries, as well as their proper action to take in treating any more serious accidents.

Don has arranged with an instructor from Oxford Sailing Club to run the course for us. The date proposed is Saturday 26th March and the training will last all day. Sailability will pay for the instructor, and we only ask that a £10 donation is made to cover the Handbook costs.

Membership Fees for 2022

We always want to make sure that Sailability is accessible to everybody regardless of their ability to pay. We do have certain costs such as insurance, fees, maintenance. We also make a payment to Milton Keynes Sailing club for their generosity in allow us to use their facilities and safety boats for a reasonable charge.

Regrettably these costs have gone up, and we ran the sailing last year on reduced fees to make up for the lack of sailing during COVID.

The committee proposed that members will make a donation to use our boats:

Individual sailing session: £10.00 per person

Family Group: £15.00 per session (e.g. siblings / parent who want to sail together)

Annual donation for individual members: £80 for the season or £120 for a family group.

First timers and new members can have a 'taster session' free of charge – although we always welcome donations.
